Sample Performance Tasks for Informational Texts: English Language Arts

- Students compare George Washington's Farewell Address to other foreign policy statements, such as the Monroe Doctrine, and *analyze* how both texts *address similar themes and concepts* regarding "entangling alliances." - Students *analyze how* Abraham Lincoln in his "Second Inaugural Address" *unfolds* his examination of the *ideas* that led to the Civil War, paying particular attention to *the order in which the points are made, how* Lincoln *introduces and develops* his points, *and the connections that are drawn between them*. - Students evaluate the argument and specific claims about the "spirit of liberty" in Learned Hand's "I Am an American Day Address," assessing the relevance and sufficiency of the evidence and the validity of his reasoning. [RI.9–10.8]
- Students determine the purpose and point of view in Martin Luther King, Jr.'s, "I Have a Dream" speech and analyze how King uses rhetoric to advance his position. [RI.9–10.6]
